They became back to back State Champions in Policy debate in March. They were invited to the Tournament of Champions, a high school debate tournament held annually at the University of Kentucky on the first weekend of May. It is the most prestigious tournament on the national circuit, representing the most competitively successful debaters for the nations most prestigious individual debate tournaments. Since its inception in 1972, the Tournament of Champions has emerged as the premier championship for high school debaters who frequently compete nationally in policy debate.

Kaine Cherry, along with his partner, also earned a bid to the Tournament of Champions as well as qualifying for the National Forensic League championship finishing in a tie for first place in the Regional Finals.

Ameena Ruffin is nominated for her contributions to both Policy Debate and Mock Trial. In her policy career she is feared for her tireless preparation and powerful argumentation style. In the statewide mock trial competition she beat several of the private schools finally falling to Friends in the semifinals.

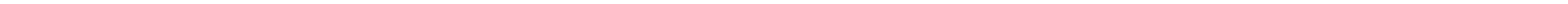
